A) Academic : -

Participation of stakeholders is more significant in making the designed program more successful. Attending the classes regularly and taking participation in academic and other activities is very much essential to the students. Following steps are designed to ensure the above;

- i. Students should wear chest cards while entering the college campus.
- ii. Attendance records of all the students should be maintained by the **concerned teachers** in their respective subjects.
- iii. **Attendance Committee** should collect Reports of Shortage of Attendance after the completion of every two months from concerned teachers.
- iv. List of the students whose attendance is very poor, should be reported to the **Local Guardians** of concerned classes by the Attendance Committee.
- v. Meeting of the Parents of absentee students should be convened by the Local Guardians of concerned classes periodically, to intimate to the parents about the irregularity of their wards.
- vi. After collecting the views from the parents about the reasons and causes for irregularity of their wards, steps should be taken to make the students attend the classes regularly. This is not only to compensate the loss of attendance but also to save them from lagging behind in studies.
- vii. The students who appear for P.E. I & II and Entrance Tests of other professional courses need to be encouraged. The college has adopted the system of encouraging such students by giving proper guidance not only for their competitive exams but also their regular syllabus so that they do equally well in the regular B.Com. Degree Course.
- viii. Keeping in line with the general guidelines laid down by the K.L.E. Society, to promote sports and games and encourage talented sportsmen/women at its institutions, the college too has adopted a few norms which precisely form its sports policy. The objective of the

entire Sports Policy is to encourage talented sportsmen so that they can contribute their best to enhance the sports legacy of the college. This is done by giving them diet, deputing them to attend all competitions and tournaments, meeting their travel expenses, entry fee, and giving cash prizes to outstanding persons etc. Extra coaching classes are conducted for them to make up the loss of their attendance and syllabus. Following is the Sports Policy of the college

Sports Policy :

Keeping in line with the general guidelines laid down by the K.L.E. Society to promote sports and games and encourage talented sportsmen/women at its institutions, the college too has adopted a few norms which precisely form its Sports Policy.

- Preference in admission is given to those students who have represented Zone, State and National Level.
- Students who desires to join the college teams should personally attend selections. However, in genuine cases where a student remains absent from the selection trials or any important tournament or match due to his ill health or any other inevitable reasons, this rule may be relaxed provided he has obtained prior permission in writing from the concerned authorities in the college.
- The selected players shall attend practice regularly.
- They are not permitted to play for any private club/organization at the time when they are required to represent the college team.
- Those who are not selected for the college teams shall not be sent to any selections, competitions, tournaments or matches.
- Irregularity and indiscipline of the players on and off the field will lead to the termination from the team.
- Written permission must be obtained from the concerned authorities in the college before participating in any tournaments conducted by private organizations.

- Incentive in the form of money will be given to State/National level participants.
 - The rules of conduct, discipline and attendance are applicable to all the students in general are applicable to sportspersons as well. Breach of these rules in any form may lead to their termination from the teams in extreme cases from the college also.
 - Any awards and prizes in sports will be given on the basis of his/her achievement in the concerned sports.
- ix. At the end of the academic year i. e. in respect of students under Semester Scheme before they appear for the end-exams twice in a year and in case of non-semester students once in a year, revision of syllabus in every subject is carried out. This helps the students to get a fairly better idea about the subject besides enabling them to do well in the exam.

B) Learning : -

The following programs are designed to initiate the habit of learning and inculcate a sense of inquisitiveness and develop a positive mind-set and competitive spirit among the students.

1. Presentation Skills.
2. Conduct of Seminars.
3. Symposia.
4. Group Discussions.
5. Debates, Elocutions, Competitions.
6. Visit to Industries, Banks, Chamber of Commerce etc.
7. Opportunities for students to develop and exhibit their talent.

1. Developing Presentation Skills :

There is a strong need to develop Presentation Skills among the students in the context of present day competitive scenario. Unless the students are trained in communication and soft skills, they can not fare better in the interviews/selections and make an entry into the employment world. So, to develop these skills in them, they are made to give talks on the

lessons or topics covered. Here, the students are made to enact the role of the teacher. It helps them not only understand the subject properly but also overcome diffidence, stage-fear and lack of confidence in them.

2. Conduct of Seminars.

Seminars are conducted on a regular basis. Students are made to present seminars not only on the topics covered but also on those yet to be covered. This helps them to refer to the relevant sources of material, collection of apt points and preparing a paper by giving a proper shape to the topic. Teachers also help them in collecting the material and preparing the paper. Team spirit, mutual understanding, self-confidence, exchanging of ideas, over-coming stage fear and lack of courage are some of the advantages of holding these seminars. Use of O.H.P. – L.C.D. is also made available.

3. Symposia.

Symposia on current topics would be held at least once in three months for each class. The college has a very strong alumni force which is always keen in helping the present batch of students. These past students, who have flourished in their life as entrepreneurs, industrialists, businessmen and business magnets are invited to share their experiences with our students. Authorities from Income Tax Department, Banks, Factories, Industries, business enterprises and merchants are invited to interact with our students. This programme helps our students to have a clear idea about the practical world, the keen competition that prevails there and the need to develop ability and skill to face the challenges they have to meet soon after they complete their graduation.

4. Group Discussions and Mock Interviews :

Group Discussions and Mock Interviews are also held on a regular feature. Batches consisting of 8-10 students are formed to have group discussion on given topics. Students are made to learn the etiquettes and manners needed for these occasions, techniques of approaching the authorities, the need to co-ordinate in a group and lead the group to

positive conclusiveness. Training on interview techniques by conducting a mock one, gives adequate knowledge and information to the students on this subject. The training given here has proved to be helpful to our students in their practical life.

5. Debate and Elocution Competitions :

The burning issues of the Society, Industry, Stock Market, banking sector, trade and commerce at both national and inter-national levels are chosen as the topics for debate and elocution. This creates an awareness in the students about some of the important current issues with which they have to deal with sooner or later.

6. Visit to Industries, Banks, Govt. Offices:

Visits to industries, banks and govt. offices are arranged from time to time. Students are sent to these sites to collect first-hand information about the working system of these units. If the venue to be the one that belongs to an alumna of our college, even free transport is provided. Students gain a lot of practical knowledge by such visits.

7. Opportunities for students to develop and exhibit their talent:

Several opportunities are provided to the students to develop their speaking and communication skills. Competitions in singing, rangoli, essay writing, quiz, collage making, numismatics etc. are conducted, giving a wide scope to the students to develop and exhibit their talent.

C) Teaching :-

1. A Teaching Plan in all subjects is prepared at the beginning of the year. The prescribed syllabus is completed well in time as per the Teaching Plan. Students are given a clear idea about their syllabus, important chapters/topics and the approximate time schedule for completion of the same.
2. The Teaching Plan will segregate the syllabus into
 - i) Important.
 - ii) Most Important.

iii) Casual and Informative.

In other words it is in the pattern of;

- a) Must know.
- b) Desirable to know.
- c) Good, if it is known.

3. Seminars, symposia, group-discussions, role-play, personality development training are a part of the whole Teaching programme and they are conducted intermittently without affecting the coverage of the prescribed syllabus.
4. Small Tests as per the guidelines of the university are also conducted, the answer papers evaluated within a week's time and the marks are intimated to the students. The answer scripts are shown to the students and any doubts on the subject, model answers to the questions and the care to be taken by them for scoring high marks are explained to them. Assignments which are also in accordance with the guidelines of the university are given to the students. The technique of writing ideal answers such as its size, presentation style, content and the language are explained to them so that they will fare better in the end exam.
5. A broad-hint about almost all the important events proposed to be carried out during the year such as functions, tests, visit of VIP's to the college, sports activities etc. are mentioned in the Calendar of Events which is printed in the Prospectus of the college, a copy of which is made available to the students at the beginning of the year.
6. A training on Personality Development, Interview Techniques, preparing for Competitive Exams is given to the students throughout the year. This helps them in getting good jobs in I.T. sector, B.P.O's etc.

D) Evaluation: -

1. The system of evaluation is as per the requirements of university and other norms. This is displayed to the students for information.

2. Examination Committee is formed by the college to announce the schedule of periodical tests.
3. Evaluation of Internal Assessment Journals is made and the results are announced on the days mentioned in calendar of events.
4. After evaluation of Internal Assessment Journals by the concerned teachers, they are supposed to redistribute them. Marks are awarded along with a remark on the poor performance made by the students. Teachers should justify the allotted marks during discussions in the class room.
5. Teachers should keep the records of performance of the students in tests, seminar etc. This record should be made available in the meeting of parents.
6. Heads of different Departments should convene Departmental meetings, every month and also after the completion of every test to discuss the performance of students.
7. Feedback should be obtained from the students after completion of every topic. This feedback covers information regarding punctuality, efficiency, commitment of teacher etc.
8. The feedback results should be discussed in the Departmental meetings. This system of feedback is used in a positive approach to improve the teaching process.
9. Circulation of good answerscripts should be made, as model answerscripts, in the class to enable other students to improve their style of answering.

E) Value Addition :-

Changing market trends, improvements in technology, presence of keen competition etc., stress the need for practical knowledge. Present syllabus prescribed by the university may not fulfill, such requirements.

On need-base, an effort should be made to introduce Short-Term Certificate courses to enhance the practical knowledge of the students in respect of the subjects they are studying.

The following self-finance courses may be introduced.

- i. Training in Practical Accounts.
- ii. Orientation in respect of professional courses like C.A. / C.S./ I.C.W.A. etc.
- iii. Conducting of coaching classes in respect of the above courses.
- iv. Training in Computer Accounting Packages.
- v. Workshops on Group Discussions, Interview techniques, product launching and simulation exercises.
- vi. Continuous career counselling.
- vii. Course in Yoga & Meditation.
- viii. Workshop on Health Awareness in General and Health Awareness to lady students in particular.
- ix. Functional Art Workshop to enable lady students to make daily using home products to learn embroidery and marketing of produced articles.

F) Extra-Curricular Activities (Academic)

1. Conduct of Debate Competitions.
2. Conduct of Elocution Competitions.
3. Conduct of Quiz and General Knowledge Test.
4. Arrangement of cultural programs.
5. Participation in Youth Festival.

G) Sports:-

The Gymkhana Department should frame the Time Table and train the students in various games. The grouping of students for selection of different games should be based on Induction Analysis as well as trial selections. The students having talent in different games are to be deputed to participate in the Inter Collegiate, University, Inter University, District level, State and National level competitions.

H) Community Services :-

1. Encouraging the students, including lady students, to participate in NSS and NCC activities.
2. Adopting a village or a locality by the college for extending community service.
3. Forming Health Club.
4. Encouraging the students to participate in Health Camp, Eye Camps, Blood Donation and Aids Awareness program etc.

I) Welfare Schemes for lady students :-

Several Welfare schemes are devised for the lady students such as Health Check-Up, Counselling by lady doctors, Yoga Coaching. All these activities are aimed at empowering the girl students.

J) Remedial Courses :-

Arrangements for engaging extra classes for slow learners conducting special classes for SC and ST students whose academic performance is poor are to be done in a systematic way.

Challenging Learners :

Similarly, special coaching for advanced learners is to be given so that they perform still better in the exam.

K) Library :-

1. A section of the library consisting of Reference Books should be made as "Open Access Library".
2. A part of the library should be converted into "Students Information Centre" and be kept under the charge of a teacher. It should provide literature regarding career programs and counselling.
3. At the beginning of academic year itself, books should be issued to the students from Book-Bank section.

4. Keeping the reading section of the library open for 14 hours every day during the days of preparation for exams.
5. A separate section is provided for the girl students.

L) Computer Laboratory :-

Internet access is made available to the students. Introduction of certificate courses should be made to utilize the existing infrastructure to optimum level.

M) Placement Cell :-

A staff-member should be made in charge of the cell. Rapport should be developed with the corporate sectors. Concerned staff Incharge should arrange for Campus Interview.

N) Redressal Cell :-

The cell should continue to work as per the S.O.P. in force.

O) Updating Knowledge of Teachers :-

1. Each Dept. should conduct workshop/Conference/Symposia at least once a year.
2. Teachers should be deputed to participate in seminars/ conference/ workshops conducted by different organizations.
3. Deputed teachers should address the staff regarding the topics of seminars etc., and a report should be submitted. The knowledge gathered and the latest developments in their respective subjects should reach the student community.

PART – B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Institution:

The ultimate objective of the various activities planned under different forums like College Union, Sports, Placements, Visits to Industrial Units, Youth Festival, Ladies Association and Women's Empowerment Cell etc. is to help our students understand the curriculum properly, provide ample opportunities and exposure to their hidden talent, develop communication skills in them so that they groom their personality to suit the needs of the fast changing world.

➤ **Teaching Plan :**

A 'Teaching Plan' in all the subjects was prepared at the beginning of the academic year. A 'Calendar of Events' containing a broad out-lay of various events spread out throughout the year was also prepared and published in the 'Prospectus' so that the students had a clear idea about them in advance. At the end of the year, a kind of stock taking was done in H.O.D.'s meeting whether all these activities were implemented or not.

➤ **Activities of Union & Gymkhana :**

Various Associations and Gymkhana Departments which were formed at the beginning of the year with an objective of giving an exposure to the students hidden talent and caliber, were kept active throughout the year. The formal Inaugural Function of the activities of these two sections was held on 21st September 2005 with Sri. M. V. Alagawadi, Director, CEDOCK as the Chief Guest.

Another Guest of honour on the occasion was Sri. Anand Sankeshwar. The college Athletic Meet was held on 8th & 9th October 2005 in which a large number of students, both boys and girls, participated actively. The Annual Indoor Game Tournaments were held in January 2006 which also witnessed a very good participation from the students. Similarly, a good number of functions were organized inviting eminent academicians, businessmen, motivational speakers etc. with a view to enable the students to not only widen the horizon of their knowledge but also to develop their personality.

➤ **Seminars :**

With the objective of increasing communication skills amongst the students seminars were conducted in every subject on a regular basis. Mock Interviews and Group Discussions were also held. Our students also participated in Youth Festival, Debate and Essay competitions and cultural programs conducted by different institutions. Several students brought laurels to the college by bagging prizes and awards in these competitions.

The College coordinated a programme with 'MPHASIS', a major player in the ITeS Sector, to assess the ground realities for making Hubli, the next IT Destination. Students of different colleges participated in the programme.

➤ **Workshop on Communication Skills and Interview Techniques :**

A workshop on Communication skills jointly organized in the college by our college and Prajavani publications on **5-01-2006** Sri. C.C. Dixit, a retired professor and a trainer in 'Personality Development' was the resource person.

➤ **Orientation Course :**

An orientation course was conducted from 6th August to 12th August 2005 for all the students of our college. Shri. J. Amarnath, Manager, L.I.C. and Prof. N. S. Katagi were the resource persons.

➤ **Independence Day :**

To inculcate the spirit of patriotism and social values amongst the students, the Independence Day was celebrated on 15th August 2005 with great enthusiasm. From the academic year 2004-05 the institution has introduced some healthy practices one of them being hoisting of the national flag by our student who has scored highest number of works at B.Com.-part II examination. This year, the privilege of unfurling the national flag was given to Sri. V.P.Kulkarni of B.Com.III.

➤ **Republic Day :**

The **Republic Day** was also celebrated with the same fervour on 26th Jan 2006. The College brought into practice yet one more healthy practice i.e., this time the national flag was hoisted by Sri. B.S. Akki, the Accountant of the College, who retired from service around the same time.

➤ **Gandhi Jayanthi:**
